**661st MEETING OF THE  
HORSESHOE BEND CITY COUNCIL**

Mayor Pat Goff called the meeting to order with Councilpersons Cooper, Corvinus, Stirm and Riley present. Also present, City Clerk Gina Elmer and Attorney Tony Pantera.

Pledge of Allegiance

Councilman Stirm made a **motion** to approve the agenda. Councilman Corvinus **seconded**. All ayes. **Motion carried**.

Councilman Corvinus made a **motion** to approve the minutes for the 660<sup>th</sup> meeting of the City Council on January 16, 2019 meeting. Councilman Stirm **seconded**. All ayes. **Motion carried**.

Councilwoman Cooper made a **motion** to pay the City's bills as presented. Councilman Corvinus **seconded**. All ayes. **Motion carried**.

**New Business:**

Jerry Kelleher:

Mr. Kelleher came before the Council on behalf of the Horseshoe Bend School District. He stated that the sewer line became plugged by the Middle School so he called Roto Rooter to help repair the line. They did not fix the problem as the main line was blocked. Jerry then called Michele and Jobie. They had to call in Pipeline to clear the blockage of paper and grease. Jerry is requesting that the City reimburse the school for a third of the bill which is \$172.16. The school district and Sonora Restaurant will also pay a third each. Councilman Stirm made a **motion** for the City to reimburse the school the amount of \$172.16. Councilman Corvinus **seconded**. All ayes. **Motion carried**.

Robert Showalter:

Robert Showalter explained that he is in the process of updating the Emergency Operations Plan for Boise County. He would like each city in the county to create a plan to be included. He says each person should be prepared for a catastrophic situation by having enough supplies to last three to six months. He sent an example plan to the City Clerk that can be forwarded to people involved in creating an EOP. There were further discussions concerning the creation of an EOP and if the City already had one in place.

Ordinance 256:

Tony Pantera explained the changes the ordinance would make concerning water/sewer billing. This ordinance would require that water/sewer bills remain in the name of the property owner or a property management company of the property served. Councilman Stirm made a **motion** to waive the three readings rule and read by title only. Councilman Corvinus **seconded**. All ayes. **Motion carried**. Councilman Corvinus made a **motion** to adopt Ordinance 256. **Councilman Riley seconded**. **Roll call: Councilman Riley-aye, Councilman Corvinus-aye, Councilwoman Cooper-aye, Councilman Stirm-aye. Motion carried.**

## **Department Updates:**

- EMS:  
Michele and Ryan are interested in going to Grangeville for the Spring Fling EMS Conference. This will provide 8 continuing education credits geared to basic EMTs. Councilwoman Cooper made a motion to send two EMTs to Grangeville and pay for their expenses, registration and t-shirts. Councilman Corvinus seconded. All ayes. Motion carried. They have had 28 runs so far this month.
- Public Works:  
Michele Brothers reported that they had Pipeline come out to clean and camera Locust, N. Riverside and Hoff. Dave Fletcher came out to do the safety inspection required by the USDA. Michele feels that the City should get security cameras for the water plant, sewer plant, and City Hall. Councilwoman Cooper asked her to look into the cost. Robert Showalter added that FEMA may have a grant for security systems.
- City Engineer:  
Amy Woodruff said that it had not been a very active month for them. She stated that Terrie Nolan had transferred the money to ITD so they can start the bidding process.
- Attorney:  
Tony Pantera- has nothing to add at this time.

## **Public Comment:**

Gregory Keefer came forward to announce that he is a candidate for County Sheriff in the election this fall. He would like to bridge the gap between this side and the other side of Boise County.

Councilwoman Cooper wants the City to look into the Vannoy property on Riverside Dr. Someone came to her with a complaint about too many unlicensed cars being parked there. Ryan Stirm has contacted Adult Protective Services to help a resident on Canyon Street. Mayor Goff would like to gather some letters of support for the Boise Street Bridge repair. Robert Showalter also added that it may be in the City's best interest to look into the impact that the CUMO mine project will have on Horseshoe Bend. Impact fees could be something the City should ask for.
